



EYE OF AFRICA COVID-19 POLICY

Eye of Africa has always been dedicated to the health and wellbeing of all our residents, members, clients and guests.

On Sunday, President Cyril Ramaphosa addressed the nation and declared a State of Disaster. We, at Eye of Africa feel morally and legally obliged to take the President's guidelines seriously and to follow the State of Disaster Laws.

Furthermore, we believe that the health and wellbeing of all who visit the Eye of Africa is, and will always be, our priority. Due to the current outbreak of the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) we would like to share our policy to date.

As a responsible business, to ensure we contribute to global attempts to slow the progression of the virus, we have put together an extensive precautionary action plan that we launched earlier this month;

- Staff education surrounding Covid-19 and subsequent hygiene measures have been undertaken - with updates on the Virus, education is ongoing;
 - Close personal contact such as shaking hands and hugging must be avoided
 - Frequent hand washing with anti-bacterial soap
 - Contact with one's own face must be avoided
 - Coughs and sneezes must be covered with a tissue that is immediately disposed of
 - Hydrate frequently
- The HOA have placed disinfectant at the entrance gates;
- The Tags will now prove their worth as no fingerprints are needed for access;
- Anti-bacterial soaps can be found in every bathroom;
- Dispensers have been placed at entrances to The Greens, The Pro Shop and the Sales Office;
- Additional cleaning and sterilisation measures have been implemented throughout the Estate;
- The Eye of Africa consistently places checks and methods to ensure that food safety and kitchen cleanliness are always up to and exceed regulation standards. All staff are trained in food safety and will continue to follow all and any updates on food safety regulations relating to Covid-19. We are bound by H.A.C.C.P and work strictly within their guidelines; and
- All events involving more than 80 people has been postponed until further notice.
 - Stringent measures of prevention and control have been implemented with smaller gatherings
 - All golf bookings will be capped at 80 players per field
 - All existing bookings can be postponed if you are concerned about your event or if your event exceeds 80 people.
